
The Americans and the Holocaust Traveling Exhibit Meredith Public Library July 29-September 4

The Meredith Public Library is pleased to announce that we were selected as one of the libraries to host the *Americans and the Holocaust* traveling exhibit through a highly competitive grant from the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C. and the American Library Association.

The 1,100-square-foot exhibition examines various aspects of American society: the government, the military, refugee aid organizations, the media and the general public. Drawing on a remarkable collection of primary **sources from the 1930s and '40s,** the exhibition tells the stories of Americans who acted in response to Nazism.

We will also be hosting a display called *American Witness*, consisting of 18 posters of first-hand accounts of those who liberated, provided aide to, or were liberated from concentration camps.

We have been working with Inter -Lakes Middle High School in order to bring every student through the exhibit during the first week of September once



school starts. Teachers have been teaching lessons about the Holocaust in preparation for this. Thanks you to Heart & Hands Thrift shop for helping to sponsor this event. I-LHMS also heard from Holocaust Survivor Kati Preston in May thanks to a grant form the Friends of the Meredith Library. The public will get a chance to hear from Kati in August during the exhibition.


